

# New in CS5

Lens correction tab in Camera Raw Converter (6<sup>th</sup> tab from the left)

- Profile tab lets you use existing corrections for most lenses. Check the “Enable Lens Profile Corrections” box. It uses the metadata in the file about what camera and lens was used for the photo
- Correction amount – moving slider to the left reduces the amount of the correction. Moving to the right increases the amount of correction.
- The V key gives you a grid – Press V again to turn off
- Manual tab
  - Each of the sliders in the Transform section can be used to manipulate the image
  - Chromatic Aberration and Lens Vignetting are the same as before

Bridge – Export tab lets you drag and drop files to export to certain sizes, locations

- Presets available by default include exporting to Facebook, Flickr, Photoshop.com (each site will lead you through a minor setup, if required)
- Create your own preset by selecting the “Save to hard drive” preset and clicking on plus sign (+) at the bottom of the panel
  - Choose the location for the files on the Destination tab
  - Name the preset at the bottom of the panel
  - On the Image Options tab select image size, quality, etc.
  - For Image Quality you currently must use the dropdown with the words and not the field with the numbers. Until it is fixed, the numbers are not saved.
- Drag photos to your new Export preset
- Click on the upward pointing arrow that appears next to the preset name and it will export them all automatically

Bridge – String substitution in Batch Rename

- Select Batch Rename and change the default Preset to String Substitution
- In “New Filenames” section choose the string of characters to replace and what to replace them with
- To make more changes to the filenames click on the plus sign (+)
- Preview the changes at the bottom of the screen

Mini-Bridge inside Photoshop – Bridge must be running

- Features include navigation, favorites, thumbnails, preview panel
- Space bar works for full screen view when thumbnail is selected
- Drag it away to undock it. Then drag it to the bottom of the image window to dock it there and use it like a filmstrip

Photoshop Preferences – Disabling tabbed documents

- Interface tab of Preferences – uncheck “Open Documents as Tabs”
