 - Fairbanks and more north for Northern Lights
 - Far north for polar bears
 - Denali park
 - South Homer, Katmai, Seward
 - Inside passage glaciers and small towns



Time of year to go


- Depends on your destination
 - Fairbanks and more north for Northern Lights
 - March
 - Far north for polar bears
 - Sept, Oct, Nov
 - Denali park May through August
 - Inside passage cruise May through Sept
 - South Homer, Katmai, Seward June thru Sept


Equipment

- Northern Lights
 - Tripod
 - Wide angle prime or wide angle zoom
 - Cable release
- Bears
 - Medium zoom 24-105 or 16-70mm ranges
 - Telephoto zoom 70-200 and/or 100-400 or longer – Take a teleconverter if you have one
- Landscapes
 - Wide angle and medium zoom lenses

Fairbanks/Northern Lights

- Fairbanks/Chena Springs
 - In Aurora oval
 - Clear and dark
 - March has highest likelihood of clear nights
 - Consider moon cycle








Fairbanks/Northern Lights

Apps and webcams are helpful in planning and learning

- Aurora strength
 - Will peak in 2025
 - Roughly 11 year cycle

Inside Passage


- Best way to see it is by cruise ship
 - Can photograph all along the way
 - Scenery on both sides of the ship
 - Stops at many quaint small towns
 - Best way to see glaciers. The smaller the cruise ship, the closer you can get.
 - Excursion opportunities
 - Riding a dog sled
 - Helicopter over glaciers
 - Whale watching Try <u>Harv and Marv</u> out of Juneau

Denali Park

- About 240 miles north of Anchorage
 - Can take a train or rent a car
- Several lodges in and around the park
- Only way to see the park (past the first 15 miles) is by bus
- Wildlife grizzly bears, moose, caribou, Dall sheep

Only way to see the park (past the first 15 miles) is by bus



Southwest Alaska

- Seward
 - Train from Seward to Anchorage is beautiful
- Homer
 - Surrounded by snow covered mountains
 - Good base for bear trips to Katmai or Kodiak Is.
 Try Emerald Air Service
 - Dozens, to 100's of eagles depending on time of year
 - Kayaking get right up to glaciers
